In addition to his academic pursuits, Mr. Hamrick is also active in the autism community. He has been an active board member of The Autism Program of Virginia, and has served as an officer of a Virginia autism society chapter in Newport News. Since 1999, he has been a frequent presenter at autism conferences throughout Virginia and neighboring states about how autism has personally influenced him.

Lindsey Nebeker is a 29-year-old woman with autism. She also has a brother diagnosed with autism. Both Lindsey and her brother were born in Tokyo, Japan, where they spent most of their early childhood before moving to the United States. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music Technology from the College of Santa Fe in New Mexico. Lindsey has been in a long-term relationship with her boyfriend, Dave Hamrick, who also has a diagnosis of high-functioning autism. She has been active within the autism community in the United States and Canada by presenting at conferences and workshops about how autism has personally affected her, and serves as the Washington DC Liaison for the Autism Women's Network. Lindsey also made an appearance in Glamour Magazine, ABC's Good Morning America and the cover of Autism Spectrum Quarterly along with Dave Hamrick in 2009.

Roxana Hartmann is a autism consultant and International speaker on disability issues and educational practices. With over 25 years of experience in the field of autism. Roxana advocates for Inclusive Education, Person Center Planning, Positive Behavior Supports, Self-determination, Friendships and Natural Supports to ensure the best outcomes for children in the autism spectrum. She is the mother of a young man with autism who is nonverbal and was fully included through high school.
