Dr. Stephen Shore, Ed.D is an assistant professor of special education at Adelphi University in New York. As a child, he was recommended for institutionalization after being diagnosed with "Atypical Development and strong autistic tendencies" and "too sick" for outpatient treatment. Nonverbal until age four, and with much support from his parents, teachers, wife, and others, Stephen is now a professor at Adelphi University where his research focuses on matching best practice to the needs of people with autism.

In addition to working with children and talking about life on the autism spectrum, Dr. Shore presents and consults internationally on adult issues pertinent to education, relationships, employment, advocacy, and disclosure.

- 4. Understand the importance of people with autism and other disabilities in understanding themselves as a key factor in success.
